She was named a Medalist in 1992. Diane has received many other awards and honors throughout her career.

Design Contributions

Diane's design projects have been published in various local magazines and newspapers. Diane possesses the proven ability to successfully integrate opportunities and objectives with human and material resources to take a residential or commercial design project from the initial consultation, back to the drafting table and on to project completion.
